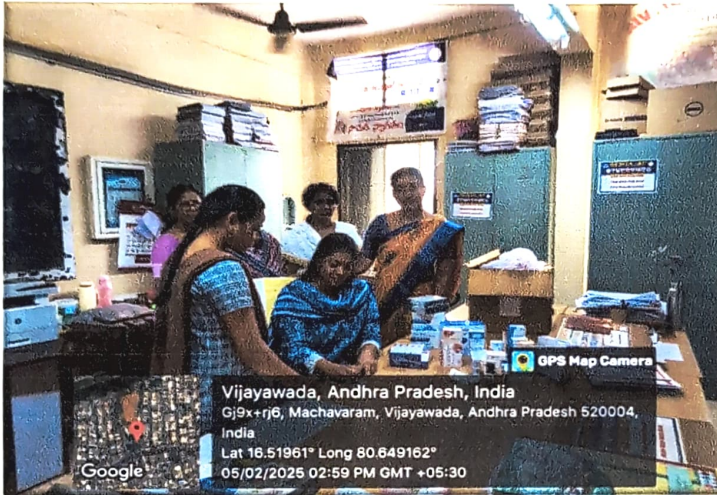

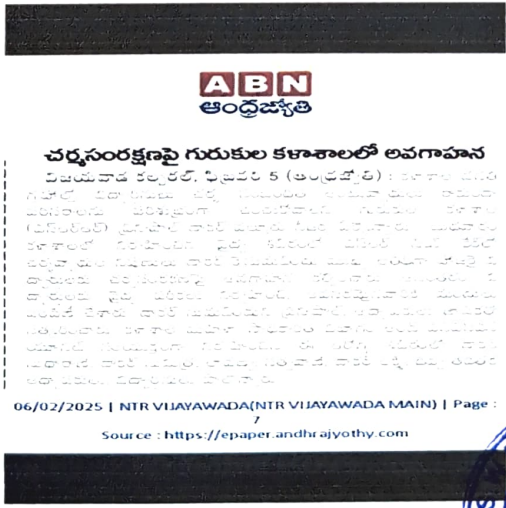
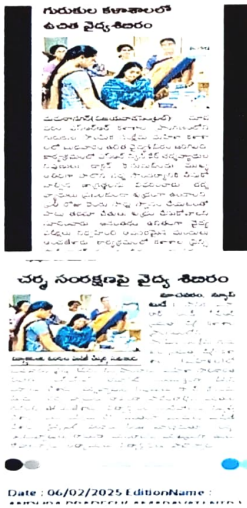
Distribution of Medicines & Creams
